UNH Students Sustainability Capstone Presentation Looked at Town-owned, including working waterfront; residential; and business properties for three flooding scenarios: 3.9, 6.1 (2050), and 10.9 (2100). Estimated value of property, based on assessments, and vulnerability of key assets, primarily roadways, potentially lost to flooding under those scenarios. Will [provide committee with final written report.
- IV. Conservation Commission request for KCAC study discussion about banning residential use of synthetic fertilizers in shoreland zone. Committee supportive but looking for an effective way to implement. Continued concern about nitrogen-based fertilizers in the Shoreland Zone but challenge to the Town finding a way to enforce if there is a ban. Communities with bans rely on reports from neighbors. Ace Hardware stopped selling synthetics but available there on special order as well from surrounding lawn and garden supply businesses. Need a statewide ban. Recommended that the Conservation Commission pursue, and KCAC will revisit in the future.
