Director's Report for KCC Board of Directors August 12, 2020

Nice to see everyone again. Hopefully the summer is treating you well. It's hard to believe that September is right around the corner.

The biggest update from the last meeting is the decision to support the School District as they make plans to re-open with a shorter school day. We are repurposing a number of the classrooms to provide afterschool care for Kittery's students in Grades K-5 from dismissal time until 6:00pm if necessary. This will allow working parents to maintain their jobs knowing that there are alternatives for their children after school. Although it could be as early as 12:00pm when school is released, there is no cost to Kittery families until our SAFE program begins which is fee-based at 3:30pm. Unfortunately, this means not having a Preschool this year. As things move forward, we will be sure to keep everyone posted on the progress. The first day of school is slated for Tuesday, September 8th.

The #KitteryTogether programming has been going smoothly and we are seeing consistent numbers at these events. We also assisted The Dance Hall in their preparations for concerts at John Paul Jones Park. We have confirmed with the Shipyard MWR that the trailer/stage will stay through October 24th and we look forward to programming more events outside through the Fall.

The Piscataqua Dog Obedience Club has moved out of the Cole St., Community Center. There is no intent to have any further use of that building.

We are finalizing our Fall/Winter hours and will start to publicize those shortly. We will be extending operating hours in conjunction with supporting the schools and increasing our activity offerings. Fall/Winter hours will begin on September 8th and we're looking to start instructor-led classes October 5th.

As discussed at the last meeting, I am including some general topics/projects that have been submitted in recent years for the Town's Capital Improvement Program:

- Fitness Equipment-to replace aging/failing equipment, etc.
- Kitchen Equipment-to replace equipment that may fail
- STAR Theater Equipment-upgrade and expand the sound capacity and lighting system giving priority to LED fixtures
- Playground Equipment-some of this has been shifted to be included in the overall facility master plan
- Gym Sound System
- Building Wide Intercom
- * Replacement of Exterior Doors-for safety and security reasons
- Increased Parking at KCC-as with the playground equipment, this could be included with overall facility master plan
- East Wing Heating and Insulation Upgrades
