

FAQ's for Snow Plowing and Removal

Q: My road has not been plowed, can I get it plowed now? **A:**The Highway Department follows an assigned route plan which includes your road...please be patient©

Q: My sidewalk has not been plowed, when will it get done? **A:** The Highway Department follows an assigned route plan for sidewalk snow plowing and removal that begins the day **after** the storm. Generally it takes 3-4 days after the storm to clear the sidewalks from a single storm.

Reminder: Depositing driveway snow over a town sidewalk or in the right of way is illegal - Fines start at \$150.00.

Q: Can you remove the snow piles at the ends of my driveway? **A:** For removal of snow buildup, residents need to contract with a private snow removal company.

<u>www.magicyellow.com</u>, input the topic, snow removal, and your zip code and a list of contractors will be created.

Reminder: It is not only illegal, but can be a serious traffic hazard to shovel or plow snow into or across the roadway. Fines start at \$150.00. If you have a private contractor plowing your driveway please make sure to remind them of this as you will be held responsible for their actions
