1. Call to Order

Chairperson Beers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. Introductory

Chairperson Beers read the introductory.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

Chairperson Beers led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Roll Call

Answering the roll call were Chairperson Gary Beers, Vice Chairperson Charles Denault, Councilors Frank Dennett, Jeffrey Pelletier, Jeffrey Thomson, Judith Spiller, and Kenneth Lemont.

5. Agenda Amendment and Adoption

Item 13d was withdrawn and the agenda was adopted, as amended.

6. Town Manager's Report

Town Manager Amaral reviewed her written report.

**FEMA Flood Maps** – This initiative started in 2014 and will impact between 60-80 properties in Town. The Town committed \$20,000 to appeal the revised maps. A proposal was received from Ransom to assist communities in the appeal process in the amount of \$210,000, which would be split amongst 7 out of 8 communities. She sought guidance as to whether or not the Town should proceed with the appeal.

**Crosswalk Signal at Walker and Route 1** – The crosswalk signal is timed properly and accurate. An exclusive pedestrian signal would have to be installed in order to address the concerns raised about timing and would drastically change the flow of that intersection. Further guidance from MDOT is forthcoming.

**Memorial Circle Improvements** – The project will begin in about two weeks. This project will add sidewalks and make other improvements. Most of the construction will occur during the night shift. Dispatch will have the appropriate contact information to address inquiries and concerns during construction.

**Transportation Planning and the Navy Shipyard** – The Town is working with PNSY staff to seek a Joint Land Use grant through the Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA). It would fund a broad transportation management plan.

**Business Park Study** – Zoning changes would be required to see development in this area. It is a site with several wetlands and vernal pools. It should be considered on whether or not to pursue development in that area. The KOSAC can help to develop a diverse dialogue of what could occur in that area.

**National Night Out** – The National Night Out in Kittery will be August 1<sup>st</sup>, 4:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the Kittery Community Center, 120 Rogers Road.

Town Manager Amaral replied to Chairperson Beers that the FEMA maps appeal process will begin soon. He asked for further information regarding the additional funding required. Town Manager Amaral replied to Councilor Spiller the notifications that were sent to the property owners in 2014. Councilor Spiller encouraged the Town to perform outreach with the property owners that will be impacted.

Councilor Thomson asked for a list of roads and intersections that the Council cannot unilaterally make decisions about.

Chairperson Beers said that there are several serious technical issues related to development exactions to property owners. He suggested the legal requirements to satisfy Supreme Court case law.

b. (070117-4) The Kittery Town Council moves to ordain a proposed amendment to Title 10 of the Kittery Town Code, to add §10.2.4 Local Traffic Only No Through Way Designated, as an Emergency Ordinance to expire in 60 days.

#### THE AMENDED MAIN MOTION MADE BY COUNCILOR THOMSON, SECONDED BY COUNCILOR PELLETIER, ON JULY 10, 2017 RETURNED TO THE FLOOR.

Town Manager Amaral noted the revised document provided includes technical revisions.

#### COUNCILOR THOMSON MOVED TO REPLACE COUNCIL ACTION ON THE JULY 10, 2017 WITH THE REVISED DOCUMENT DATED JULY 24, 2017 WITH THE ADDITION OF 446 UNDERLINED TO READ LANGTON, SECONDED BY COUNCILOR SPILLER.

Councilor Dennett suggested to amend the motion to indicate the following at lines 444-445: Water St, between intersection of Rice Ave and the intersection of Newmarch St. The maker of the motion and seconder concurred.

### VICE CHAIRPERSON DENAULT MOVED TO AMEND THE DOCUMENT DATED JULY 24, 2017 TO INCLUDE WATER ST, COMMERCIAL ST, PLEASANT ST, AND COTTLE LANE.

Councilor Dennett objected to the consideration because it did not have the benefit of a public hearing and Chairperson Beers ruled the motion not in order.

#### VICE CHAIRPERSON DENAULT MOVED TO POSTPONE ACTION UNTIL THE NEXT REGULAR MEETING. SINCE THERE WAS NO SECOND, THE MOTION WAS NOT DISCUSSED.

The Council discussed the intent of the emergency Ordinance is to implement a pilot program. It will be evaluated to determine whether the concept improves safety and reduces traffic.

Economic Impacts of the combined courthouse in York County.

Councilor Dennett described the fiscal impact of the initiative on Kittery residents. He stated in opposition of the courthouse being relocated. Vice Chairperson Denault echoed that statement and noted the additional costs to the Police Department. The Council reached consensus to make a formal consideration for a resolution in the August 14, 2017 regular meeting. Councilor Spiller noted that consultation from the district representative would be helpful.

#### 14. COUNCILOR ISSUES OR COMMENTS

Councilor Thomson described the communications he received regarding potential uses for the Safford School building and suggested a workshop to be held on September 12, 2017 to discuss further on the matter.

Vice Chairperson Denault requested an update regarding an Ordinance review for LED lighting. He suggested restarting the Energy Committee. He noted a complaint was received that people driving Town vehicles have been sighted smoking, using their phone and drinking coffee. He recognized those who have recently passed.

a. Communications from the Chairperson

A workshop on July 31st at 5:30pm will be held to discuss Charter amendment proposals.

A notice from the Police Department was announced indicating that the Shaw Brothers Construction, Inc., in conjunction with the Maine Department of Transportation, will be temporarily closing the Route 1 Bypass in Kittery from the intersection of State Road to the intersection of Bridge Street from August 7, 2017 through August 28, 2017 for road work on the Route 1 Bypass. Traffic will be detoured via State Road, Government Street and Bridge Street for the duration.

The Planning Board forwarded the draft 2015-2025 Comprehensive Plan to Council for consideration and requested that it be voted on August 28<sup>th</sup> to be placed on the ballot for the November election. Chairperson Beers called for each Councilor to state whether or not it would be reviewed in the requested timeline. The majority of Council stated it would not be feasible.
