### 6. Town Manager's Report

Town Manager Amaral reviewed her written report.

**Resource Recovery Center** – Data was collected over a 40-day period and revealed about 3.3% of all Resource Recovery stickers were non-compliant. Stickers will now be issued at the time of annual vehicle registrations.

Legislative Delegation – Senator Dawn Hill, Representative Deane Rykerson, and Representative Mark Lawrence have tentatively confirmed to meet with Council on March 27<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm. Councilors should provide specific issues or topics to be discussed beforehand.

**FEMA Flood Maps** – FEMA has declined the request of York County towns to hold a public session on the revised Flood Maps prior to finalization. The Town is in opposition of this decision and have raised the issue with Senator King's and Senator Collins' offices.

**Update on Dineen** – Mr. Dineen is scheduled for a hearing on April 5<sup>th</sup> and the judge is seeking an update on his progress towards achieving compliance. Mary's Store case is still awaiting a hearing date with Maine Supreme Court.

**Sewer Line Break** – MMA determined the Town is at fault for the sewer main break on State Road and they are working with Mr. Spencer to determine what expenses can be covered under insurance. Mr. Spencer hopes to reopen at the end of March.

Town Manager Amaral reviewed an item not included in her written report.

**Battle of the Badges** – Kittery Police and Fire Departments are participating in the Battle of the Badges on Thursday, March 16, 2017 at 6:30p.m. at Traip Academy to benefit cystic fibrosis research and raise funds to support Trevor Salema.

Town Manager Amaral responded to Councilor Spiller that a message can be generated in the online vehicle registration instructing residents to renew the Resource Recovery sticker at Town Hall. She clarified that the stickers will be renewed at the time the vehicle is registered and expires after one year.

Councilor Spiller noted that the citizen Library Committee will soon provide Council an update on their progress.

Councilor Spiller questioned the status of Councilor Pelletier's request from the previous regular meeting for Council to take action to refer Vice Chairperson Denault's report of complaints from constituents to the Town Manager. Chairperson Beers clarified that Attorney Dale's opinion is that it would be inappropriate for Council to refer the matter to the Town Manager per the Charter and State statute. The matter continues to be handled towards resolution. He apologized for failing to communicate the Attorney's opinion to the Council through the Town Manager.

Vice Chairperson Denault noted the Labor of Love group and Jeffrey Brake are interested in providing support for a house on Bartlett Road to remedy structural issues and Code violations.

Chairperson Beers regretted missing the workshop with the Economic Development Committee. He noted that quarterly workshops with the Planning Board and Port Authority have been conducted and will continue to be addressed in the future.

held on March  $1^{st}$  was the most attended lecture to date. A second lecture was scheduled for April  $3^{rd}$  and reservations have already been filled. The KCC looks to schedule a third lecture in the Fall season due to the popular demand.
