

# Frequently Asked Questions Snow Plowing & Removal



Please see below for FAQs and answers about snow plowing operations.

Q: My road has not been plowed, can I get it plowed?

**A: The Public Works Department follows an assigned route plan which includes your road, please be patient, we will get to you.**

Q: My sidewalk has not been plowed, when will it get done?

**A: The Public Works Department follows an assigned route plan for sidewalk snow plowing and removal that begins the day after the storm. It can take up to 3 days to clear all of the sidewalks from a single storm.**

Q: Will Public Works remove the snow piles at the end of my driveway?

**A: Residents are responsible for removal of snow build-up in their driveway whether completed by the resident or contracted with a private snow removal company.**

## Important Reminder Snow Plowing & Removal

**Shoveling or depositing driveway snow onto a Town sidewalk or Town road is not only illegal, but it can be a serious traffic and safety hazard.**

**Repeat offenders may be subject to fines of up to \$500.00.**




# Recommendations Driveway Snow Removal

Please see below for recommendations on how to remove snow from your property.

## DO!

**Do move snow from your driveway onto your own property.**

- A.** If standing on your property facing the road, move snow to the right or left of your driveway.
- B.** Clear the area of your property next to your driveway and near the roadway. This gives plows a place to push snow and helps reduce the chance of a snow berm being created across your driveway.





# Recommendations Driveway Snow Removal

## DO NOT!

Do not push snow into the roadway or right of way.

Plowing, blowing, shoveling or otherwise placing snow onto public roadways is illegal. This includes pushing snow across the street or into the ditch and right of way area along the street.

Pushing snow creates hazards including:

- Drainage problems.
- Drifting.
- Sight obstruction and hindered accessibility.
- Slippery areas.
- Frozen ruts or bumps that can contribute to motor vehicle or pedestrian crashes.
