At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Kittery, in the County of York, qualified to vote, held on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2022 the said inhabitants gave in their votes to approve Articles 2 through 9, and to approve the School Budget Referendum. Article 2. Shall the town vote to authorize the Town Council to transfer up to \$125,000 from unassigned funds (unencumbered surplus) and appropriate and expend up to \$125,000 when necessary to maintain a positive fund balance in the Compensated Absences account and to pay for accrued vacation and/or sick leave to settle any unpaid benefits owed to retired or terminated employees in the fiscal year?

Article 3. Shall the town vote to authorize the Town Council to transfer up to \$25,000 from unassigned funds (unencumbered surplus) and appropriate and expend up to \$25,000 when necessary for the purpose of paying the town's cost on accepted insurance claims against the town?
